The school has an environment that is stimulating and conducive to learning. There is a broad and balanced curriculum which is tailored to meet the needs and interests of all our students and utilises new technologies. There is no gender stereotyping with our students just as likely to successfully follow STEAM subjects (science, technology, engineering, art and maths) as language and humanities courses. We are also committed to providing an education that promotes global awareness and that encourages girls to look outside the "Wokingham bubble".

Teaching staff are experts in their subjects and are encouraged to be reflective and innovative practitioners. They work hard and are committed to achieving the best for their students. Older students including the 6th form act as great role models to whom the younger students look up as they do to the many past students who regularly return to the school to share their experiences and success. It is good to hear our alumni reinforce the "aim high, work hard, be kind" message.



A strong partnership with parents and carers has been shown to be a significant factor in how successful a young person is at school, therefore communication is key in strengthening that relationship. We will keep you informed about your daughter's progress through regular reviews and parent consultation evenings. We will contact parents and carers when things go well and when we have concerns and we ask that you do the same.

In addition there are regular blogs and newsletters that keep parents up to date with what is going on in school and information evenings that will help you support your daughter as she moves through the school. We also have a Virtual Learning Environment (Frog) which is a safe online system through which Parents (as well as students) are able to see what home learning has been set and also access tracking data on progress and attainment. Challenging our students to work hard

There are many day visits, curriculum based field trips and adventure weekends. There are also longer residential visits in this country and abroad including long standing exchange trips. There really is something for everyone.

Every girl who joins The Holt will receive a very good education, however that education only becomes great if they make it so by taking advantage of the opportunities that are available to them.





Student Leadership

There are numerous roles that girls throughout the school can take on to develop their leadership skills. The very strong House system provides many opportunities to lead from House Captains in Year 7 to Prefects in Year 11 and the Senior Prefect Team and subject prefects in the 6th form. Student voice is an important part of school life with all form groups represented at Year Group Councils and each year group represented at Student Council.



Enrichment Opportunities

Recognising the importance of developing the whole person we actively encourage all students to take part in the wide range of enrichment activities that are on offer at The Holt. The thriving House system gives rise to numerous inter house competitions - sport, music, drama, dance, art and many more besides. Students take part in local and national competitions including Magistrates' Court Mock Trial Competition, Maths Challenge and science Olympiads to name just three. There are many visits in this country and abroad in addition to curriculum based field trips and adventure weekends.
