Dr Linda Yueh

Dr Yueh is a Fellow in Economics at the University of Oxford and a visiting Professor at LSE IDEAS, the London School of Economics and Political Science's foreign policy centre. She also serves as Chair of the LSE Economic Diplomacy Commission and is an Associate Fellow at Chatham House. She will be speaking on her new book, 'The Great Economists: How Their Ideas Can Help Us Today', and her talk should provide a brief history of economic thought and explain how we can apply the insights of the past to the problems of today.

Mr David Lubin is the head of emerging markets economics at Citi and an Associate Fellow in Global Economy & Finance at Chatham House. At HSBC, he was also involved in sovereign debt restructuring negotiations with governments in Latin America and Eastern Europe. His recent book, 'Dance of the Trillions: Developing Countries and Global Finance', was chosen by the FT as one of the best economics books of 2018. Drawing upon his decades-long expertise in capital flows and emerging economies, he will be speaking on the topic of 'Globalisation: The End of the Road'.
