Re: Year 10 - End of term letter

We have finally reached the end of a long 15-week term and Year 10 have successfully started their GCSE courses. Whilst the transition to GCSE poses many challenges, I have been impressed with the determination and resilience demonstrated by our students. It has been wonderful to observe so many of them embracing the challenges new subjects have to offer as well as developing their depth of knowledge in areas they have studied before. When Year 10 come back in January the focus will be on continuing to progress in these areas as well as preparing for their PoR PPE taking place on Monday 14th January.

It has been a busy term with a number of activities taking place and I have been pleased to see so many members of the year group displaying enthusiasm and being good role models to the younger years. Back in September, Year 10 participated in the preparations for Harvest which involved decorating boxes and collecting produce for the elderly in the local community and Wokingham Food Bank. Year 10's generosity and spirit of kindness really shone through. Year 10's charitable endeavours continued with a superb event organised by Charlotte and 10S: Teachers Come Dancing! Here we saw staff being choreographed by Year 10 before competing in an exciting lunch time show which raised over £300 for Children in Need. Earlier this term, the whole of Year 10 took part in Enterprise Day where students learnt more about the world of business and bringing products and services to market. The Year 10 business students also attended a trip to Land Rover Jaguar.

There are still lots of house points to play for with the Christmas door competition results yet to be announced.



As the term draws to a close, I always look forward to presentation assembly where we recognise the progress, achievement and efforts of the year group. It was wonderful to see so many students receiving certificates and awards for their hard work and diligence. It was also fantastic to see so many talented performers. Yui, Isabel and Caitlin gave a beautiful rendition of John Legend's All of Me. Caitlin's acapella solo at the end was particularly moving. Elana, Gemma and Isabel also stole the show with a beautiful vocal of Ed Sheeran's Happier. And then to close, Freya and Lucy brought the festivities with a guitar performance of Your Song. I also want to say a big thank you to all of the students who prepared speeches; public speaking can be a little bit nerve-wracking but the quality of what Year 10 always deliver continues to impress me. It was a superb celebration of the talent in Year 10 and may this be set to continue as we enter 2019.

Musically Year 10 continue to impress and a special well done must go to Suzi for her piano recital at St. Mary's Church in Shinfield earlier this month. Alice also performed superbly at the Remembrance service with many guests commenting on her grace and maturity. Many Year 10 students also sang in the Christmas Concert at St. Paul's Church last Thursday. This included most of the GCSE Music class but a special mention goes to Alexine for an outstanding performance.

Recently an audit was undertaken as to how many Year 10 students are participating in extra-curricular activities in and out of school. It is encouraging to see so many Year 10 students embracing these opportunities to develop their character. In the world of today, employers want to see well-rounded individuals who have many strings to their bow as well as academic achievement. I would ask you to support us by encouraging your children to join in with what the Holt has to offer by joining a lunch time or after school club, running for form captain or being a student council representative. Many of our students do this already as well as competing outside of school too.
