Re: Year 12 - End of term letter

We are coming to the end of a very busy term for Year 12 and a year of transition and progression. Adapting to A level study and independent work is not easy and we have watched your sons and daughters grow in maturity throughout the year. Many have learnt how to manage their time and to use their "study" periods effectively with help and support along the way. The exam week was a culmination of all their hard work and revision as well as a time of reflection.

The summer term has seen many enrichment opportunities for Year 12 and not only will they have developed in confidence by taking part but they will have more to refer to in their personal statements and CVs. There have been several trips, subject talks and conferences which students have really enjoyed. The new leadership and sixth form prefect team have been mixing and working with their new House members in lower school and contributing so positively to the community spirit of The Holt. Sixth form students have "thrown" themselves enthusiastically into House events and many inter-House activities, sports day as well as doing regular classroom attachments in lessons.
