Who can do an apprenticeship?


There is no definitive answer......

- There are different entry requirements for Apprenticeships depending on the occupational sector, level and employer requirements
- An apprentice must be living in England and not in full-time education
- An apprentice must be16 years and above and be at the statutory school leaving age
- An apprentice must be committed to work and learning and aware of their responsibilities to themselves, their employer and training provider

Different levels of apprenticeships available

Intermediate apprenticeship

- ·Level 2
- •12-18 months
- •Equivalent to 5 GCSEs A* - C

Advanced apprenticeship

- ·Level 3
- •18-48 months
- •Equivalent to 2 A-levels

Higher & degree apprenticeships

- ·Levels 4,5,6,7
- •24 months+
- Equivalent to foundation degree level+



UCAS and Apprenticeship information day

WEX Format

- A work place visit for one to two days in different organisations,
- a job shadowing experience for one to two days,
- a placement for 3 days in one organisation
- a longer term 'block' placement for 2-3 hours a week in study periods.

WEX does not include paid employment that students do in addition to their studies

Route A - You source your own WEX placement

- Complete a WEX form outlining what you hope to learn from the placement you have sourced.
- An email is sent to the employers to confirm the placement – with your details, any additional needs and the dates and times of the placement.
- The employer will complete a brief student feedback form following the WEX.

Route B – need help finding a placement

- Complete a 'Need help find a placement' form in which you state a preference for the WEX sector you would like to engage with and what you hope to learn from the experience.
- Sixth form team will send out letters to prospective WEX employers, parents, alumni and friends of The Holt to gain a database of placements.
- Careers lead will match the placements and confirm with students.
- An email is sent to the employer to confirm the placement –
 with student's details, any additional needs and the dates and
 times of the placement.
- The employer will complete a brief student feedback form following the WEX.
