

The Holt School Catch Up Premium 2019-20 - Review

Introduction:

The literacy and numeracy catch up premium is additional funding given to schools to support Year 7 students who did not achieve the expected standard in any one of the three key stage 2 tests:

- Mathematics
- Reading
- Grammar, punctuation and spelling.

At The Holt we use the catch up premium to contribute to the funding of our ICA curriculum. The 'Inspire, Challenge, Achieve' Curriculum is designed to support students who enter The Holt School below national age related expectations. Students are taught in smaller teaching groups for all humanities subjects and English. All students cover the same curriculum content; however, the ICA group have a higher adult to student ratio to accelerate student progress.
